Ageism in society: practices, policies and interventions introduces participants to theoretical and empirical accounts concerning multi-disciplinary settings and contexts in which ageism occurs (e.g. workforce, health care, long-term care, social care, media). The second main theme of the seminar focuses on policies and practices related to ageism and older adults at the international, national, and municipal levels. Third, the seminar discusses pertinent topics of dissemination and the broader and practical impact of ageing and ageism research.

The seminar is organized by the Tampere University in the context of Marie Skłodowska-Curie ITN –project EuroAgeism, which is funded under European Commission's Horizon 2020 programme. The project aims to perform quantitative and qualitative in-depth analyses of ageism in selected Central and Eastern European countries, with a specific focus on the labour market and retirement policies.
