Recognition of 50 Years since Coinage of the Term "Ageism" at Aberdeen Training Event



At the end of August we had a wonderful supplementary three-day training event hosted by the team at the Robert Gordon University in Aberdeen, Scotland. The training event opened with a discussion on observations and examples of ageism with invited guests from the RGU Ageing Research Network. That evening we were warmly welcomed to Aberdeen by the Lord Provost at the Town House in Aberdeen City. Following sessions of the training event were presented throughout the weekend on a variety of topics, including: ageism and its impact on performance; maximizing the impact of research and engaging policy stakeholders; and enhancing employability through development of CVs and social media profiles. All attending ESRs presented their research to-date and received constructive feedback from professors and fellow ESRs. We had some fun, though, with a traditional Scottish Ceilidh dance on Saturday night!

Secondments

In the last year most ESRs have already started or completed secondments in various policy, civic, and academic organizations, such as AGE-platform, RGU, UNECE, Alzheimer's Israel (EMDA), Peking University, and UNESCAP.

These secondments have yielded many exciting achievements, such as: conducting research for the Working Group on Ageing Taskforce at UNECE; evaluating a technology based support group for people with dementia at EMDA; contributing to the #AgeingEqual campaign and the questionnaire of the UN Human Rights Council Advisory Committee on emerging technologies and human rights at AGE Platform Europe; organizing the Aberdeen training event; and many other learning and networking outcomes.

Dissemination Activities & Publications

Since the last newsletter, we have been participating in international conferences such as the IAGG-ER Congress in Gothenburg, the Aging and Social Change Conference in Vienna, the European Society of Clinical Pharmacy in Ljulbjana, the European congress of European Union of Geriatric Medicine Societies (EUGMS) in Krakow, the International Association for Media and Communication Research conference in Madrid, and the European Sociological Association in Manchester. Also, two international scientific meetings of FIP7 program on medication use and aspects of ageism were held in Tampere in February and in Ljulbjana in October 2019.
